Assoc Prof Dr Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim, Minister of State, Ministry of Home Affairs & Ministry of National Development, accompanied by Mr Eddy Asmara, Assistant Director (Rehabilitation) from Policy Development Division/MHA, Ms Loo Sook Nee, Senior Assistant Director (Programme Management, SPS) and Ms Serena Lim, Senior Assistant Director (Community Corrections, SPS), paid a visit to The Helping Hand.

Upon arrival, MOS Faishal and the team were met by two of our Board members and the CEO. They were then ushered to the meeting room and briefed by the management team about the programs and services of The Helping Hand, followed by a question and answer session.

After the session, MOS Faishal was given a tour of the premises where he met and talked to some of our residents and viewed their living quarters.

He was then brought to our Furniture Gallery to see our teakwood furniture imported from Indonesia and ended the tour spending some time looking at our Urban Farm which was recently established.

It is truly our privilege to be able to host MOS Faishal and we want to thank him for taking the time to come visit us. We also thank the Singapore Prison Services for arranging the visit.

We hope and pray that all our staff will grow in Christlikeness, be rooted and established in their faith, and live out their Christian lives as disciples of Christ for the glory of God the Father.

The Helping Hand started its inaugural baking classes on 25 September 2020 and we are very thankful to have Mr Fleming Michael William, Director Training of Cereal Tech School of Baking from International Baptist Church come and teach this skill to three of our staff - Gina Ang, Lim Choon Hock and Lim Jim Khern. They will be having two baking lessons and two practice sessions per week.

Once our staff have acquired this skill, they will in turn impart this skill to our residents as we aim to introduce baking as one of our work therapies. We believe that baking has its therapeutic value as the process requires our guys to lovingly prepare the dough, wait patiently for the bread to bake and finally have a sense of joy and accomplishment when the bread is ready for consumption. Aside from its therapeutic value, the skill learnt from baking will increase their employability options once they complete their program with us.

As for all the delicious bread and buns that are being baked right now, they will be solely for our own consumption but eventually we intend to sell them at our café once we get the necessary clearance from the relevant authorities.

We take this opportunity to say thank you to Mok Lee Bakery Machine Pte Ltd for lending us two units of ovens and a Unit Mixer free of charge and Mr Fleming for helping to arrange for it.
