On 13 October 2020, The Helping Hand (THH) was privileged to have the new Commissioner of Prisons, Ms Shi Yong Lee, and her entourage, consisting of Mr David Tan (Deputy Commissioner of Prisons,

Policy, and Transformation), Mr Wilfred Wee (Acting Director, Community Corrections Command) and Mr Ho Kim Teck (Senior Assistant Director, Programme Management Branch, RRD) visit us.

The purpose of this scheduled visit was for the new Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner to introduce themselves as they have just taken over the roles, learn more about THH's programmes and regime, understand our challenges, and to see how they could further support us, if necessary.

Upon their arrival, they were received by our Chairman, Rev Dr Yap Kim Sin, together with our Vice-Chairman, Ms May Loh, CEO Mr Mervyn Lim, and ushered to our conference room for a video presentation of THH followed by a fruitful dialogue session.



After the session, the Commissioner and her party had a tour around our premises, where they visited the residents' dorms, our Furniture Gallery of imported teakwood furniture as well as our recently established



Urban Farm. During the rounds, the Commissioner also took the time to speak to some of our staff and residents.

We are thankful to the Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner and the team for taking the time to come and visit us and we look forward to a closer and better working relationship in helping our residents stay out of trouble and successfully re-integrate back to society.

ALLIANCE OF HALFWAY HOUSES



An alliance between 9 Halfway Houses (8 HSM Halfway Houses and Highpoint Halfway House) was formed in March 2020 to promote collaboration and partnership during the Covid-19 pandemic. Our initial meetings were through Zoom but on 6 October 2020, we were able to have our first physical meeting at The Helping Hand with SMMs in place. We are thankful that HEB-Ashram, Breakthrough Missions, Jamiyah





Halfway House, Teen Challenge, and Highpoint Halfway House were able to be present. Absent with apologies were Green Haven, The Turning Point, and Pertapis Halfway House.

The initial twice a month meetings were mainly focussed on dealing with the Covid-19 situation faced by the halfway houses and we are thankful that as we shared our various concerns and best practices during those times, we were able to generate ideas and find solutions to help one another through the situation.



Now even as the Covid-19 situation is beginning to improve, the alliance will continue to meet once a month to seek opportunities for future partnership and collaborations. Our



collective goal in this alliance will be to work together to help our residents stay away from their vices and



be gainfully employed. In doing so, we hope to be able to bring down the recidivism rate and help our residents re-integrate successfully back to society as contributing members once again.

We are truly thankful for every halfway house in this alliance and we hope and pray that as we continue to have our scheduled meetings at

the different halfway houses, our collaboration and partnership will yield much fruit and achieve the desired outcomes we have set before us.

The Christmas Celebration anchored by our aftercare volunteers in small groups started with prayers and a simple Christmas message. Residents had a heart-to-heart conversation about what Christmas means with each other, and believers were offered an opportunity to share their salvation testimony. The facilitator gave everyone present a chance to make a personal response and spend time to pray for one another. We are blessed by the love and dedication of our partnering churches!

As part of our ongoing efforts to bless and strengthen the relationships of our residents and their families, the Social Work Department and Chaplaincy Department conducted a Christmas home-visit and brought some 20+ residents' home for an early Christmas Celebration meal with their loved ones. Residents were given a Christmas card to write to their loved ones, and some families even commented that this is the first time that they had received a card from them. Some were brought to tears when they read the Christmas card written by their loved ones. One resident commented, "Helping Hand didn't have to do this, but they went the extra mile to bless us!" We pray that through this little act of loving our brothers, our residents and their families may know the love of Christ and experience the true joy of Christmas!

With the generous support from our donors and partners, we were also able to bless some 17 needy families with a special Christmas care pack that contains helpful essential items such as basic groceries, face masks, and anti-bacterial handwash. Our residents were beaming with joy when they received the extraordinary care from our Social Workers. Praise God! Indeed, we are grateful for all that the Lord has provided, and the strong partnerships from the larger Christian community. Thank you for your support and prayers for our ministry! Please continue to keep us in your prayers for the work ahead of us.
