Maundy Thursday Service







After 2 long years, The Helping Hand ("THH") was finally able to have our first combined service in the chapel on 14th April 2022, to commemorate Maundy Thursday, the day Jesus Christ celebrated His final Passover with His disciples.

THH's worship team led everyone through a blessed time of praising God before Richard Khalil shared a message from John 13: 1-17. The passage spoke about how Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under His power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God.

Although Jesus knew what would eventually happen, He went on to do something that was unimaginable. After taking off His outer clothing, wrapping a towel around His waist, and then pouring water into a basin, he began washing His disciples' feet, and drying them with a towel. Our Lord Jesus took on the appearance and attitude of a servant.

After He had finished washing his disciples' feet, Jesus asked the disciples if they understood what He had done. Jesus told

the disciples that He as their Lord had done this to set an example for them, one that they were expected to follow, an example to serve with humility.

Jesus' final act of love before He went to the cross was to serve with humility. Just as the disciples were reminded then, we too need to be reminded that as we serve God, we must also serve with humility.





For the second part of our service, THH observed the Lord's Supper led by Rev. Jason Goh. Before giving out of the Lord's Supper, Rev. Goh explained the spiritual significance of the meal and that we should partake of it with reverence and thanksgiving.

We thank God for the combined Maundy Thursday Service and the joy of being able to come together in worship as one big family in Christ. We pray that as we listen to His word, we will indeed follow the example of our Lord Jesus Christ and serve one another in love and humility.

Beach Cleaning At East Coast Park

What is Community Service? Community service is work done by a person or group of people that benefits others in the local community.

On 11 April 2022, 10 residents from The Helping Hand ("THH"), accompanied by two staff from the Social Work department and another two from the Chaplaincy department, went to East Coast Park Area E to conduct a beach cleaning activity.

The team arrived at the park at 9.30 am and was briefed by Social Work Manager Raymond Chow. After the briefing, the residents were each assigned to a team of two. Joined by the staff members, they spread themselves out and went around the park to pick up rubbish around the area, while also enjoying the beautiful scenery of East Coast Park. The teams picked up a couple of trash bags full of rubbish.



This activity is part of the overall rehabilitation programme at THH and aims to inculcate in the residents a sense of social responsibility and contributing back to the community. By helping to clear unwanted rubbish in the beach area, they help make the beach a safer, cleaner, and more conducive hangout for beachgoers. THH conducts community service activities once every two months on an ongoing basis.

Our prayer is that these activities will help residents to foster a sense of belonging and togetherness; and educate them on the importance of mutual help between one another.

THH Employers' Forum 2022













Vocational stability and career prospects are essential for successful reintegration of ex-offenders back into community to help them become productive citizens who can once again contribute to society.

Employment is one of the strongest protective influences against recidivism. Records show that recidivism rates are much lower among ex-offenders who obtained stable and long-term employment after their release from prison.

However, the main career barriers that ex-offenders face are, a) lack of employability skills such as limited education, (b) limited work opportunities due to discrimination from criminal record and stigmatisation from employers; and (c) lack of motivation.

On 27 May 2022, The Helping Hand ("THH") Social Work Department organised its inaugural Employers' Forum at its Multi-Purpose Hall from 9.00 am to 12.30 pm. Nineteen participants from six companies attended the Forum. These companies have employed a considerable number of THH residents who have opted to collaborate with external employers during the third phase of their Community Rehabilitation Programme.

Mr. Mervyn Lim, CEO of THH, gave the opening welcome address. He was followed by representatives from THH and the Singapore Prison Service giving an overview on topics including:

- (i) The Mindset of a Drug Addict
- (ii) The Skillset in engaging THH residents
- (iii) The Challenges in journeying with an ex-offender

The THH Social Workers were also present at the forum. After the presentation, the floor was open for queries and questions from the participants. There was lively dialogue and open discussion, and it was refreshing to see participants gaining more knowledge about THH rehabilitation programmes, a better understanding of our residents, and how to help them at their workplaces. It was also a good opportunity for the employers to build rapport and widen their network with THH and Singapore Prison Service.

Bike Restoration Project







Cycling as a form of exercise became popular in Singapore in 2020 – thanks to the COVID-19 pandemic. The demand for new bicycles and bike parts soared to

an all-time high. The average waiting time for bike servicing ranged from a few days to months depending on the extent of work to be performed on these two-wheelers. In April 2022, The Helping Hand ("THH") jumped on the bandwagon and started a bicycle servicing and restoration project as one of our social enterprise activities ("SEA").

The process of bike restoration is of particular significance to the ex-offenders undergoing rehabilitation at THH.

It starts with scouring through discarded bicycles collected from condominiums. While working on the bikes, the staff interact with the resident assigned to this SEA. It is through such relationship building that the staff journey with the resident and help the latter discover the transformational power of our Almighty God.

As the staff and residents painstakingly repair and restore the once discarded bike to a "new" condition, it is a reminder of how our Lord went to great lengths to save us from our sinful condition and renew us. The apostle Paul confidently declared this promise in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new."

Seeing an old and abandoned bike restored and given a new lease of life brings satisfaction and a sense of pride to an ex-offender. More importantly, our prayer is that this SEA will help ex-offenders appreciate the value of their newfound identity in Christ


