
The turn-out was encouraging and the event started with our

Ride & Run 2022



















The Ride & Run to Restore 2022 was a fundraiser organised to celebrate the 35th anniversary of The Helping Hand. Unlike the previous year's fundraiser, this year's event was in a hybrid format (virtual and physical) and included the cycling and walking/running event. This exciting and meaningful fundraiser attracted 115 participants and \$182,777 was raised through the generosity of many donors.

In the virtual segment, participants who took part in the cycling event covered a distance of 25,144km while those who walked or ran completed 2,139 km. In the "Longest Total Cumulative Distance (Cycling)" category, the participant braved a total distance of 2,483.25km in the 2-month virtual race period.

The physical ride/run/walk segment of the fundraiser called, "Go the Extra Mile" or GtEM, was held on 2 July 2022. Participants who were members of the public were paired with ex-offenders on a physical 35km ride or 3.5km walk. During the ride or walk, they had the opportunity to interact with the ex-offenders and learn more about their journey of restoration.

The Helping Hand had the privilege to partner with Break the Cycle SG (BtC), a ground-up initiative by cyclists to use cycling to break the cycle of recidivism in Singapore. The volunteers from BtC rode and guided the participants throughout the entire 35km ride. Our residents who took part in this physical ride were very encouraged by these volunteers who befriended and motivated them.

We look forward to Ride to Restore 2023 and may our Lord use this fundraiser to raise awareness of the work of The Helping Hand. We are here to transform ex-offenders to live Christ-centred lives.

Learning Urban Farming Techniques











